Copyright :



A law that protects a person's original work.

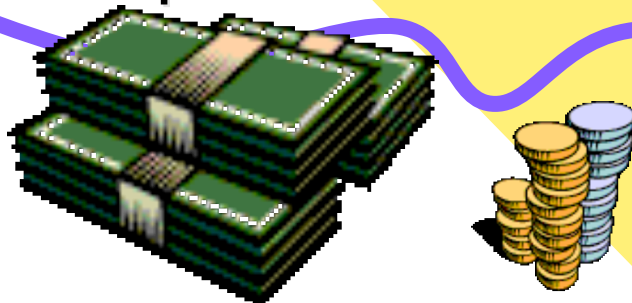
- Music

- Written works (Books, poetry etc.)
- Dance choreography
- Movies & Television
- Company logos
- Photography

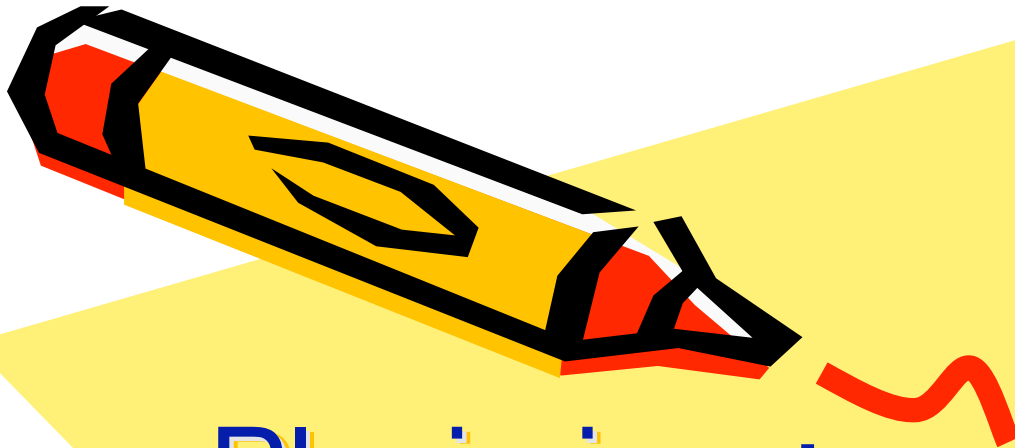




Copyright

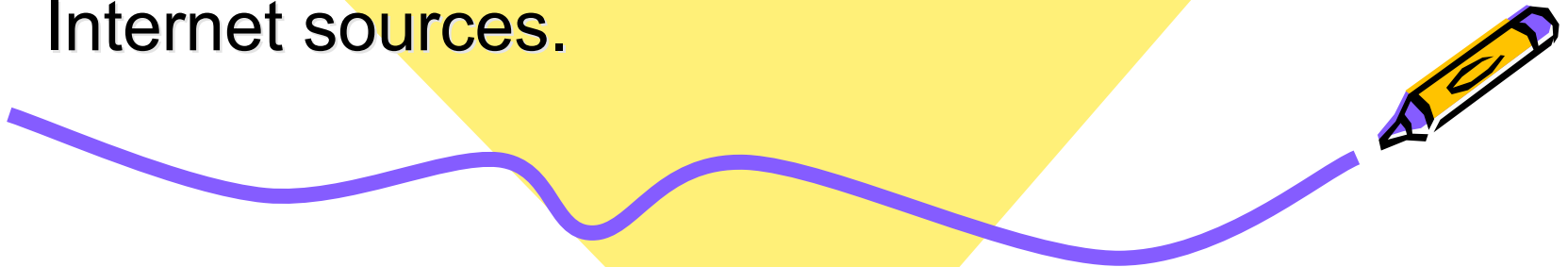
- Copyright - rights to produce and sell original works of art
- The creator owns the rights to reproduce and receive compensation or recognition for their work.
- Be careful not to use copyrighted work without permission from the owner.





Plagiarism :

- Taking the work or ideas of others as your own.
- To copy the words of others from print or Internet sources.



To Avoid Plagiarism:



- Put the words of others in quotes “like this” and cite your source.
- Put information into your own words.
- Ask permission of the author.





Rules to Remember :

If its on the Internet or in print, it's published.

Plagiarism and copyright are serious issues!
